## Chairman's Message Bob Dengler, NO6B



Fellow TASMA members:

Well this time I can't say things have been uneventful for the past few months since our last newsletter. The FCC just released its decision on several requests for rulemaking, including Kenwood's request to allow auxiliary station operation on 2 meters. To my surprise the FCC granted this request, & as a result 144.5-145.8 & 146-148 MHz is now available for auxiliary links. This means that fixed point-to-point RF links just like those used to connect major linked repeater systems like Cactus, CalNet, Condor & Edison are now legal on most of the 2 meter band. Additionally, TASMA has received its first Request for Coordination (RFC) for a full-duplex digital (Icom's "DStar" format) voice repeater. While I don't expect DStar & P25 to achieve significant usage on our bands anytime soon, it is an issue that we obviously need to think about now in terms of coordination & bandplanning.

As usual, we will have our open forum discussion at our annual meeting on December 2nd. However, this particular forum will be a critical one for us as we will focus on the above two issues of auxiliary operation, digital voice modes, & how best to accommodate these changes via our bandplan & coordination policies. Your input at this one meeting will help shape the future of 2 meters, possibly for many years to come. Don't miss out!

## Membership Levels Have Become Critical Howard Brown, KG6GI

Our Treasurer informs us that our membership is likely to be down 10 to 15 percent this year; and that less than half have renewed through the first 10 months of the year. This is of serious concern to your Board. Membership means several

things. First, it generates the income to allow us to serve you well and in an open manner. It provides 3 extensive newsletters each year and a comprehensive web site. Your participation allows us to obtain useful amateur community input for such things as changes to the band plan.

TASMA is part of the infrastructure that allows us all to enjoy our hobby. For example, the FCC provides regulations and enforcement authority defining limits that allow us to operate with a minimum of interference. The ARRL is our lobby for new priorities. The coordination associations provide us with regional band plans to separate non-complementary modes. They provide the ability to operate repeaters so as to limit interference. And finally they provide input to the repeater directory.

For the repeater owners/operators we protect your repeater's operation from interference from uncoordinated operations and provide a vehicle for resolving conflicts. For users, we provide the band plan you need to enjoy all modes of operation. For clubs, via the bandplan, we provide frequencies for your special events through functions such as packet, portable repeaters and special modes such as IRLP or Echolink.

## National Frequency Coordination Council (NFCC) Howard Brown, KG6GI

The time for the elections for those positions to be elected this year has come and passed with no activity. The matter was discussed as recently as late September with no action taken.

The NFCC Board is aware that they have made little inroad regarding recognition with either the ARRL or the FCC but also recognize that they must put the NFCC house in order first.

In early September, these were a series on messages exchanged regarding the issue of coordinating Icom's D-Star digital radio system provoked with NARCC having received their first RFC for a system on Mount Diablo in the Bay area. To add some complexity, Bill Cross (FCC) has recently written that D-Star is not a repeater but is willing to entertain a proposal for a NPRM. The discussion faded out after a week or so with no conclusion.

## Update Your E-Mail Address

Many of the e-mail addresses on our list are quite old and the Board is concerned that members may not be able to receive communication including the newsletter or the Reflector. Mike maintains the list based on addresses provided on membership renewal forms.

3. Financial Spreadsheet presented by Howard KG6GI. The spread sheet showed that Expenses exceeds Income. The problem is a decline in membership. Our current membership is 76. Mike reviewed the data and that we are doing better than the previous three years, but the low membership makes us unable to fully cover expenses. This due to membership being lower than planned in the budget. We can still revert this before the end of the year, by increasing membership. In the worse case scenario the result will still be much better than previous year due to the fee increase. Mike also mentioned the technical committee has not submitted any expense, and so the numbers may be biased at this moment.
4. Mike presented the membership report (Howard displayed the table from the newsletter) describing the trend to be a declining membership. With membership being 76 at the end of July. Mike also mentioned the budgeted was develop assuming the same membership level of last year (around 95 members).
5. There was a general discussion of membership and the following points were made.
  - a. The Repeater owner / operator should be more supportive with membership and participation at meetings.
  - b. Clubs should have a membership and encourage their members to also join and support TASMA
  - c. We should have user communities.
  - d. There is a need for a membership Chairman.
6. Mike WW6MM, our Internet Services Manager discussed a review of services. This was a description of the Internet services that TASMA uses, and the fact that we now fully depend on the electronic storage of all our data. Bob contributed, by mentioning some of the information that is stored electronically and the potential of accept RFC changes on electronic format in the future.

Greetings to our members; the sun now sets on 2006. I'll keep this one short and sweet. During this time we've accomplished a few things. Our efficiency has improved somewhat as we try to regroup and a stable meeting place was secured. The meeting location is reasonably central for our committee members as well as the community at large. This is

important with gasoline having risen dramatically in recent years.

The committee has kept a vigilant eye on the band. Delinquent systems have been identified from time to time, their trustees usually cooperative when we ping them. Unfortunately this cannot be said for all. Cases where communication fails usually result in de-coordination. An item or two exist at present having dragged on since mid to late last year for this sort of reason. We prefer giving the most possible rope to trustees, but there is a limit. If someone is unwilling to cooperate, we can't grind our wheels forever.

Positive progress continues to be made in our RFC Form project. Howard has continued tweaking our template & the fully-interactive version should soon be available. It'll reside in our forms section with the present manual-fill version. (<http://www.tasma.org>) The interactive version facilitates fully electronic submission. The form is printed locally when submitted to ensure applicants retain their own hardcopy record. Electronic submission is yet another step toward timelier processing by TASMA. The quicker our reception of data, the quicker it's evaluated & we have a basis for in-meeting discussion and formal processing. Where appropriate, we can contact trustees where requests are obviously incompatible or where errors in data are present and address these before it takes additional meeting cycles.

Speaking of meeting cycles, these will grow slightly. Year 2007 will see the TC meet quarterly (once every 3 months) vs. 2006's once every 2 months. We plan on addressing more between meetings. The extra time helps both ourselves and those to whom letters are sent.

As always, I would like to thank the committee members for their efforts and the TASMA Chairman for his support. The Technical Committee and I look forward to serving you, the community, in the coming year.

This year, we have kept the expense part of the equation under control, mainly by a technical committee that does not expend much. However, we have done a poor job on the income side of the equation, because the membership level that was used to calculate the budget seems today very optimistic comparing it to the actual numbers.

In general, we are doing ok from a financial perspective; the real problem is in the membership numbers. From a financial perspective the problem is lack of membership retention and capture of new members, from an organization perspective the problem is not only the decline on membership, but also the lack of member participation.

## 2006 10<sup>th</sup> Month Membership Report

This year we are doing better on the membership renewals than in previous years. Looking at the membership by the end of October, 41% of the expired members have renewed their membership. The calculation goes like this, 5 + 54 expired members have not renewed plus 41 expired members that have renewed gives a total of 100 membership expired this year, of those 41% have renewed. This seems to indicate that we are down to the core members that are committed to the organization. That is the good news.

The bad news is that membership continues to decline and we are not capturing new members to replenish the attrition. In the past ten months, we have enrolled only four new members, which is not enough to maintain the organization. With 285 repeaters listed in the TASMA web site under the repeater list, and with only 37 repeater owners as TASMA

members, something is out of alignment. It means that 87% of the 2-meter repeaters in Southern California are not represented in TASMA.
